

## **DSA POLICY ON TEAMS ELIGIBLE FOR JML CUP POINTS**

*Deaf Sports Australia* has **RULES** about what teams are eligible for JML Cup points in the *Australian Deaf Games* – i.e.

- What teams **CAN** get JML Cup points for a State
- What teams **CANNOT** get JML Cup points for a State

**To get JML Cup points for a State, MORE THAN HALF the players in a team must be from that State.**

So if there are 15 players in a team and 8 or more players are from WA, then the team **CAN** get JML Cup points for WA.

But if there are 9 players in a team and only 4 players are from WA, then the team **CANNOT** get JML Cup points for WA.

And if a team of 10 players has 5 players from WA and 5 players from another State or States, then the team **CANNOT** get JML Cup points for **any** State.

**The number of players from a State that are needed for a team to be eligible for JML Cup points is shown below.**

<b>TEAM SIZE</b>	<b>NUMBER OF PLAYERS FROM ONE STATE FOR THAT STATE TO GET JML CUP POINTS</b>
<b>15</b>	<b>8 or more players from one State</b>
<b>14</b>	<b>8 or more players from one State</b>
<b>13</b>	<b>7 or more players from one State</b>
<b>12</b>	<b>7 or more players from one State</b>
<b>11</b>	<b>6 or more players from one State</b>
<b>10</b>	<b>6 or more players from one State</b>
<b>9</b>	<b>5 or more players from one State</b>
<b>8</b>	<b>5 or more players from one State</b>
<b>7</b>	<b>4 or more players from one State</b>
<b>6</b>	<b>4 or more players from one State</b>
<b>5</b>	<b>3 or more players from one State</b>
<b>4</b>	<b>3 or more players from one State</b>
<b>3</b>	<b>2 or more players from one State</b>
<b>2</b>	<b>Both players from the same State</b>
